

# CAMPERSHIP APPLICATION

**Funds available for camp scholarships, or “camperships”, come from generous donors who want to help Scouts overcome financial barriers. It is limited to youth members of Oregon Trail Council attending summer camps operated by the council. Please provide comments on as many of these factors as possible or appropriate.**

1. Financial need, including family income, number of persons in the family, siblings being supported in this or other camping experiences, medical situations, unemployment, cost of parents attending council-sponsored training programs, etc.
2. Efforts by the Scout to help pay their own way.
3. The Scout's efforts in advancement and leadership areas.
4. Family situations, such as single-parent family, no parent family, institution living situation, etc.
5. Other special needs of the Scout which warrant consideration.

The council campership committee is concerned about the individual needs and the unit evaluation of the Scout.

Camperships are limited to no more than 50% of the camp cost. Each Scout, his family, or his unit must provide a minimum of 50% of the camp cost.

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## COMMITTEE CONSIDERATIONS

### Monetary effort of the Scout

“A Scout is Thrifty” – A Scout works to pay their way. Please describe what the Scout has done to provide their own way to camp. This is a character-building opportunity to learn the importance of being thrifty.

### Family needs

Describe the circumstances that require assistance. Use an additional page if needed. Family income is important in evaluating the need, but not mandatory. In the case of divorced parents, it is assumed that child support is being received unless otherwise indicated.

### Unit endorsement

Provide the number of registered youth in the unit and number of youth going to camp.

Consider the Scout's attendance at meetings, campouts, and participation in council fundraisers (candy/meat stick and/or camp card sales). The unit should consider evaluate the Scout's advancement efforts, citizenship, the value of this camping experience to the Scout, the efforts of the Scout family in support of your unit, etc.

Multiple applications from a single unit for the same amount of assistance (and especially the maximum amount available) generally indicates that the unit has directed the Scout and/or the family in identifying the amount of assistance needed. Applications are evaluated based on individual needs, not unit needs.
