Range Conduct and Discipline Policy

2/1/2024

All persons on the range are expected to exhibit “Scout Spirit”, which is defined as the daily living of the Scout Oath, Law, Outdoor Code, and Motto. This expectation is there for all aspects of Scouting and continues on the range. Anyone behaving in an unsafe or disruptive manner may be removed from the range by any one of the range personnel.

All persons on the range are expected to show appropriate self-control and self-discipline.

All persons on the range are expected to follow reasonable directives.

All persons on the range are required to abide by the rules of the SOP.

All Youth Protection Guidelines, Guide to Safe Scouting, and BSA Shooting Sports standards must be followed at all times.
